Genesis 11:10-32

1. Opening icebreaker: What is your *number one* takeaway from our study of Genesis?

2. Our passage today includes a transition from one period of Biblical history to another.
 - a. How do you know when you have reached a transition point in your own life? Can you think of an example of a transition that you handled especially well, or especially poorly?

 - b. Have you ever faced an unexpected and unplanned for transition? What was the experience like?

3. What themes, images, or ideas have come up over and over again in our study of Genesis? Do you see any of these repeated in the reading for today?

4. God repeatedly commands his creatures to “be fruitful and multiply.” Read Ezekiel 36:8, Mark 4:26-29, and Matthew 7:15-20.

- a. What connection do you see between these passages and our study of Genesis?
 - b. What does bearing fruit or “being fruitful” look like in these verses?
 - c. What parts of your spiritual life do you desire to see “be fruitful”?
5. Read John 20:11-16. What connections do you see between this passage and what we have studied so far in Genesis?
6. This first part of Genesis ends with a family’s journey and settling in one place.
- a. What role has family played in our study so far? What role does family play in your own spiritual life?
 - b. Where else in Genesis (or in the rest of scripture!) do we see journey, movement, and travel?
 - c. How might a *journey* be a metaphor for our own life with Christ?
