Tuesday Bible Study: Week 1

1. “The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.” Where do you most need this to be true *right now* in your own life? What “darkness” do you see in the world or in your life. Where/how can you look for light shining there?
2. John’s prologue says that the *Logos* is not static but “*turned toward God*”—a word of intimacy and relationship. How do you imagine *your own* relationship with God right now: turned toward, turned away, distracted, hesitant, curious? What helps—or hinders—that turning?
3. John says that life itself becomes “light for all people.” How do you encounter Christ in *life* – not arguments or explanations? What would it look like to live a life that is a “light” to others?
4. God doesn't always come to us the way we expect. Where do you think we are most likely to *miss God’s presence* because He shows up too simply, too quietly, or too close to home?
