Tuesday Bible Study: Week 3

1. John calls the wedding at Cana the first “sign” through which Jesus reveals his glory. Where in your own life have you seen God’s glory? Is this more often unexpected and quiet, or dramatic? Which is easier to spot?
2. The mother of Jesus tells the servants to “do whatever he asks you.” What characteristics of Christian faithfulness does she model for us in this passage?
3. The wine Jesus provides is not just adequate, but abundant—in both quality and quantity. Where else in scripture do we see this super abundance of God’s goodness?
4. In the second half of the chapter, Jesus drives people out of the temple, disrupting familiar religious practices. What kinds of spiritual “tables” might Jesus still want to overturn—in the church, or in your own patterns and habits?

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5. Jesus' actions in the temple provoke confusion and resistance rather than immediate understanding. Have you ever had to overcome the feeling that God wasn't doing things the "right" way or the way you expect?

6. The chapter ends by saying that Jesus did not entrust himself to some who "believed," because he knew what was in them. What is the difference between belief that is *surface-level* and trust that is deeper and more costly?

7. In this chapter we see Jesus both celebrating and confronting. Which of is easier for you to accept from Jesus? Which do you tend to resist, and why?
